Policing matters: PCSO Nia Humphrys gave an update of policing issues in the area. Councillors suggested: School visits to raise awareness re child safety etc. Setting up a 'Farm watch' group following reports of intruders on farms and theft of fuel; Drug awareness talk etc. Response time for calls continues to cause concern. White van speeding & speeding hotspots was discussed. Reminder to sign up to OWL system.

YFC Rally Dance – Members of the Carmarthenshire YFC attended to discuss arrangements for the forthcoming event in early May. Various concerns were raised with a view to minimise disruption to the local community viz. Through traffic disruption; Problems in village related to alcohol consumption; control measures to prevent under age drinking; Small incidents affecting the elderly in particular. Antisocial behaviour; More stewarding discussed – on site – stop anyone leaving unless they are in a vehicle; publicise no mobile phone reception; Removal of posters after event. Police support on the night – more required off site – presence would be appreciated in the between the site and the village; Risk assessment (Streamline). Police will contact YFC Office to get more information beforehand. Council supportive of YFC and hoped the event will be a success.
