Community Buildings

Points to consider:

- In the past the village has discussed and explored a number of possible options for a community centre but no action has yet been taken.
- Cilycwm has a tradition of hosting high profile and successful performances and events: (eg Welsh National Opera, Millennium Pageant, Gwyl Bro Dinefwr, Small Nations Festival,)
- The pub, the school, the church and the chapel are the historic social and spiritual centres of the village, but none of them has the facilities or space at present to work as a village hall or community centre.
- The School and the Church are under threat of closure
- St. Michael's Church, Ysgoldy Fach, Capel y Groes and Capel Soar are all fine historic buildings but cannot depend on their small congregations for their future upkeep.
- Ysgoldy Fach is under threat from erosion of the river bank and general dilapidation.
- Any decision taken now will have long term effects on the future of the village

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Comments: (4) against - (1) didn't know – (1) possibly- (1) a bit of a trek from one to the other-What are the pros and con's for options a) and b)?- (1) Too small on it's own. Capel y Groes is better option in many ways. Have you studied option appraisals/consultations done previously by community group when considering School Garden? – (1) This option could work but concerned re onus on Church finances, a few members would find it impossible to subsidise the costs. Funding for development and running expenses is a major concern, options should be examined carefully – (1) or to use the Chapel instead!

b) a joint Community and Church initiative to bid for a capital grant to convert the whole of Ysgoldy Fach for community use. The Church would retain ownership but assign a long term lease to Cilycwm Community Association who would then be responsible for the on-going running costs.

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Comments: (4) against - (1) Not large enough - (1) too expensive - (1) no car parking - (1) potential for flooding is an issue, what would be the running costs? - (1) maybe too small, need more info. on proposals/plans, maybe more useful to add option a)

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c) None of the above.

Comments: (1) I do not know enough to comment - (1) A new centre would have a secular basis and should produce a wider responsibility for care and maintenance. If this is not possible the Capel Y Groes offers the best central sized premises for present use and reasonable heating and maintenance. The Church has in my memory been filled to capacity several times, it is of great spiritual, historical and architectural importance, any alteration would require great sensitivity – (1) We are all aware that in time the school will close. Is it an option to buy the school? We already use it for meetings etc., toilet facilities are already there. I understand that a lot of work would need to be done, is this feasible? - (1) Consider Capel y Groes, the Church and Soar Chapel for 'rescue' grants? May bring the community together?- (1) The school is the obvious first option, what are the chances? (many advantages: 'neutral' grounds and parking space).
