2. All exhibits in the Marquee, must be laid in their proper classes by 11.45 a.m. with the correct exhibitors number tab, stuck safely, on their entered exhibit in each class. (No prizes will be awarded to incorrectly or non numbered exhibits).
3. Exhibitors must pay strict attention to the wording of competition and number of articles named in the schedule. This rule will be strictly enforced.
4. In Local Classes, exhibitors must be resident within a 3 miles radius from Cilycwm Village Square.

9. The Committee will make careful arrangement for the protection of the exhibits and will not be responsible for loss, damage or accident that any exhibitor or spectator may sustain.
10. Presentation of cups and awards will be made in the Marquee, as near to 4.30 p.m. as possible. The Horticulture section will pay out prize money from 5.15 p.m. on day of show. Any money not collected by 6.30 p.m. will be deemed to be a donation.
11. The right is reserved to alter, supplement or cancel any part of the programme and rules.
