 Exhibitors must not remove exhibits or prize cards before then or they will forfeit their prize money and awards. This rule will be strictly enforced. Any exhibits remaining in the Marquee after 6.30 p.m. will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- All exhibits in the Marquee, must be laid in their proper classes by 11.45 a.m. with the correct
 exhibitors number tab, stuck safely, on their entered exhibit in each class. (No prizes will be
 awarded to incorrectly or non numbered exhibits).
- Exhibitors must pay strict attention to the wording of competition and number of articles named in the schedule. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 4. In Local Classes, exhibitors must be resident within a 3 miles radius from Cilycwm Village Square.
